

Summary map of national or subnational carbon pricing initiatives that are implemented, scheduled or under consideration




- 64 carbon pricing initiatives implemented or scheduled for implementation, with another 23 under consideration.
- **45** national jurisdictions are covered by these carbon pricing initiatives, with another **13** under consideration.
- **35** subnational jurisdictions are covered by these carbon pricing initiatives, with another **9** under consideration.


Emissions Reduction Projects Generating carbon credits

- Projects and the carbon credits they generate are verified under different international standards.
- Projects can also provide co-benefits (social, cultural, economic and other environmental outcomes).




Carbon Market Developments Global growth and investment

- Global activity in the **voluntary carbon market** is rapidly expanding.
- New initiatives are developing to **scale the market** and **drive integrity**.
- Rules on carbon market mechanisms (Paris Rulebook, Article 6) will be a focus at COP26.




Australia's carbon units and certificates

- Australian Carbon Credit Unit (ACCU)
 - > 1 tonne of CO₂ equivalent sequestered or avoided
- Large-scale Generation Certificate (LGC) and Small-scale Technology Certificate (STC)
 - > 1 megawatt hour of electricity generated from renewable energy, displacing electricity from fossil fuel generation



Overview of the ACCU Market




ERF projects registered and ACCUs issued by method type










Overview of the STC and LGC markets



Estimated installed renewable energy capacity






Voluntary demand of ACCUs and LGCs

Emissions Reduction from ERF and RET, 2011 to 2021




